496. At 10:00 a.m. Municipal Police Corporal, J. Singh, announced the arrival of the Chairman of Council, Alderman Dr. Allen Sammy.

Councillor Roy Kissoon led in prayer.

497. **CHAIRMAN'S OPENING REMARKS:-**

The Chairman welcomed all to the Ninth [9<sup>th</sup>] Statutory Meeting.

He advised about having the Statutory Meeting on the outside to make the residents aware of what is happening in the region, particularly when we are facing a water crisis despite being in the middle of a construction boom and a 5% unemployment rate the government continues to boast.

The Chairman read an article from the Sunday Express dated April 22, 2007 entitled "You want to judge me." The article has expressed the feeling of hopelessness in our society despite our quality of life and with an estimated 18% of the population squatting – 50,000 on public lands and 50,000 on private lands. He explained that the article was on murder accused, Anita Anamottodo, who lived within the Prime Minister's constituency and he could not help people even within his area.

He also remarked that he visited the water hydrant yesterday [23 April, 2004] at 11:30 a.m. and observed the Corporation water contractors were sidelined by the Water & Sewerage Authority trucks who were filling before, thereby hindering our ability to deliver water to the residents on a timely basis.

The Minister of Public Utilities and the Environment told the Corporation to continue water delivery but there is no water in the lines to fill the trucks.

**ANNOUNCEMENTS:-**

498. The Chairman announced that Councillor Willvan Ramlakhan and Councillor Premchand Sookoo asked to be excused.
499. Councillor Roy Kissoon announced that the La Romaine Government Early Childhood Centre, at Church Street was opened and, because the Prime Minister was invited to the opening, the entire Church Street was paved. It was very disrespectful that he was not even informed nor invited. He also announced that bees infested a house owned by Mr. Premnath Ramnath of La Fortune and would like something done urgently.
500. [i] The Chief Executive Officer was then asked to update everyone on the status of water distribution.

The Chief Executive Officer remarked that he tried to contact the Minister of Public Utilities but failed. He also tried to contact the Permanent Secretary, and Deputy Permanent Secretary, but this also failed. There is \$20,000 to last up to Friday April 20, 2007.

[ii] Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh stated the water situation has become a crisis since the meeting with Wayne Joseph, Colin Nym, Mr. Poon Kin, Regulated Industries Commission [R.I.C.] and other top officials of W.A.S.A. At that meeting the Corporation was assured that it would get what was required to assist, however, to date we have not received anything.

He continued to say that the water trucking schedule should not be controlled by one person, and Members of Council were not respected when they made requests on behalf of residents. Some residents were receiving water each day and others did not receive water for almost four [4] weeks. He made four requests but not until the Chairman called that Mr. Rahay was able to get water and he is an employee of the Corporation.

Councillor Premanth Boodoosingh expressed thanks to the lower hierarchy of the Water & Sewerage Authority [W.A.S.A.], namely Mr. Ali, Mr. Elias and Mr. Rampersad for bringing some relief to the residents. He said Mr. Elias remained in Gandhi Village to ensure all the residents received water.

He also stressed that something has to be done about the management of water schedule and Mr. Sathi alone should not be in charge. He said there is information that a series of Penal/Debe contractors were selling water to residents and hoped that the Chairman of Public Health Committee could be given some respect at the hydrant so that could get some issues clarified. He continued that it was very shocking that people have resorted to putting padlocks in their water tanks to avoid stealing of water.

[iii] Councillor Diptee Ramnath stated that there is a crisis with water. He contacted the Personal Assistant to the Minister of Local Government and the Permanent Secretary and was told they were in Tobago at the time but would look into the problems. With the information given by the Minister of Public Utilities it appeared that the Corporation was responsible for water distribution to residents, and Council should ensure that this statement becomes a reality.

[iv] The Chairman stated that he received a call from Mr. Anslem De Coteau of N.S.D.P. giving the Corporation approval for weekend delivery of water. However, the Chairman advised Mr. De Coteau to contact the Chief Executive Officer and also send the confirmation by way of printed correspondence.

He commented that last year over \$125,000.00 was overspent in Truck Borne Water and this year might also see the same over spending if we do not get any supplemental releases.

The Chairman also announced that he had a 15 minutes live interview with Radio 91.1F.M. and told everything with respect to water.

501. The Administrative Officer II announced that the Accountant, Works Supervisor I and Mr. Andrew Dipchand were attending a meeting with the Sportt Company at Couva.

Also the Public Health Inspector III was attending a meeting with Insect Vector Control Division to discuss rat baiting around the jogging track in Palmiste Park.

502. Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh announced that no garbage was collected in Block 5, Palmiste on April 23, 2007.

Her stated that Mr. Elias, Mr. Bullock, and Mr. Jaggernauth of W.A.S.A. caused him to send his phone bill to \$300.00 and after the high profile meeting with W.A.S.A. officials he thought things would have changed but things remained the same.

He remarked that this Prime Minister has fired the Indo Trinidadians from W.A.S.A. and other Companies and hired his friends and families and placed them in high positions, but now the Prime Minister is saying those people need changing because they are not performing.

Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah indicated that the residents of Union Hall Bronte were always given a raw deal when it comes to supply of services, especially with water and electricity. When he spoke to Mr. Elias from W.A.S.A. he kept giving him a runaround.

He then thanked Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh for representing him in his absence.

549. **Councillor Rampersad Hardial made the undermentioned comments/requests:-**

People in Penal/Debe are accustomed to floods in the rainy season and during the dry season water is a crisis. Very soon crops and livestock may be affected by this water shortage. He stated that all the government needed to do was build reservoirs in the Southland to collect the flood waters. Two wells were drilled by W.A.S.A. in Clarke Road but no one is getting water. He supported the initiative of the Chairman and the Chief Executive Officer to get water at all cost and hoped it would be a success.

Councillor Rampersad Hardial indicated that the “Smartcards” were being given to P.N.M. Party supporters and not the needy that are deserving of it. Like this, the government was using water as a political tool to get votes in the U.N.C. areas.

He continued to say that the Prime Minister went on a visit to Diamond and environs and, when he observed the residents protesting staging a protest for water, he abruptly terminated his visit and hastily left the area.

550. **Councillor Roy Kissoon made the undermentioned comments/requests:-**

After overnight paving of Church Street for the Prime Minister’s visit there is now the need for the provision of speed humps, pavements and the side streets needed paving as well. It was disrespectful that he was not invited nor any member of the public except for the school children from the school the Prime Minister was opening.

He added that while Church Street was also marked off overnight, there are other more urgent needs for road marking such as a turning at Lagoon, Woodland in front of Mr. Steven Bar. Also at the beginning of the M2 Ring Road needed proper marking indicating there are three lanes.

551. **Alderman Roland Hall made the undermentioned comments/requests:-**

[i] He received a copy of a correspondence by an Attorney-at-Law with respect to outstanding payment owed to Ashton Aluminum Glass Supplied and would like an answer.

The Chief Executive Officer answered that this claim along with others were for work done on behalf of the Sport Company at Wilson Road Club House. A meeting was taking place with officers from the Corporation and Sport Company and after that meeting there might be a resolution regarding all claims.

[ii] Alderman Roland Hall enquired about the newly erected speed humps along Suchit Trace and why have they cracked so soon.

The County Superintendent stated that heavy dumps trucks transporting earthfill damaged the humps and they would be removed and rebuilt.

[iii] He sympathized with the people suffering for water.

[iv] The situation with the employee [Koongie] making threats to Senior Officers was very serious and something needed to be done to rectify the situation.

552 **Councillor Diptee Ramnath made the undermentioned comments/requests:-**

[i] The water crisis remains a constant problem during dry season in Penal/Debe. A meeting with senior W.A.S.A. officials was held and serious concerns were raised where we were informed that ten [10 ] water wells were to be drilled in order to satisfy the needs of the Region. That was supposed to be completed by now but only three wells have been drilled and he could not say about the others.

He remarked that the Government Ministers were blaming the Corporation but they are not releasing the necessary resources so that the Corporation could satisfy the water needs of the residents.

[ii] The bridge in Goodman Trace was impassable. The garbage truck and the water trucks are unable to pass and the residents were suffering only because the supplier cannot supply the materials.

[iii] He also said the amount of garbage from the Penal Market was too much & the market should be scavenged on mornings and evenings on Fridays. The stench emanating from the underground drain in Penal Junction was affecting the business places and something needed to be done urgently.

[iv] Congratulated the Clarke Rochard Primary School on their cricket victory, and commended the Chairman, Members of Council and the Chief Executive Officer in their efforts to bring some water relief to the burgesses.

553. **Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh made the undermentioned comments/requests:**

The Government has enough money to ensure that everyone has water but the residents of Penal/Debe are deprived of water and no amount of money could rectify this because it is a management issue at W.A.S.A. Likewise internally, truck borne water has the same management problem because Council's policy was not followed.

The issue raised with respect to Mr. Koongie making allegations about corruption in the Corporation is very serious and some action must take place. Those allegations and threats were not investigated properly by Administration nor was any action taken. However, when false allegations were made against Mr. Alexander he was immediately removed from his post as Transport Forman. He wondered if there is victimization in the system.

Councillor Boodoosingh indicated that he noticed everytime something start to work good in the Corporation it tends to be destroyed. The Personnel & Industrial Relations Officer [P.I.R.O.] Section hired workers and no Member of Council was informed to make recommendations. Over the past 3-4 years no Councillor had any input in the employment list and the former P.I.R.O.'s Wife and brother-in-law enter the work force without initial service.

He complimented Mr. Zaffar – Ag. Road Officer II, for the road improvement at the Debe Sub Office and putting the water tank in the truck to ensure continuous work in the construction gangS.

The democracy of Trinidad and Tobago was being threatened. Mr. Panday was denied access to the Parliament.

The Heritage Festival Week was fast approaching and he knows it would be successful.

The Palmiste Park Committee received a letter for upgrading but no work has started.

It was becoming impossible to control the mosquito infestation in Palmiste area and suggested that representation be made to the Ministry for extra work to be done.

Totally embarrassed with the number of emergency shelters in Penal Debe Regional Corporation listed in the Local Government Service Directory.

Mr. De Coteau of N.S.D.P. gave commitment for lighting of Tulsa Trace Picnic Site, Gandhi Village, Hillpiece Recreation Ground, Palmiste Boulevard and the Park. They have only responded to the Boulevard so far.

There would be a W.A.S.A. meeting with residents of Upper Gandhi Village and some expenses would be incurred.

554. **CHAIRMAN’S CLOSING REMARKS:-**

The Chairman reminded all of the lunch to be held on April 26, 2007 for Administrative Professional Day. Also he would be out of the country for the week-end.

There being no further business the Chairman thanked all for attendance and terminated the meeting at 11:12 a.m.

The practice in the Personnel & Industrial Relations Officer's Section was that the former P.I.R.O. employed his wife and brother-in-law in the Corporation and Members of Council were not given opportunities to make recommendations. No advertisement was done to advertise or inform the public of vacant positions. Drivers were employed and Council raised concerns regarding the criteria.

Mr. Newton Joseph who resides in Point Fortin is employed in the Corporation as a temporary driver. He asked if it was because Mr. Joseph has a close relationship with someone in the P.I.R.O. section that he was employed and if this was the criteria used for his employment. Mr. Joseph along with other persons came through illegal practices when Mr. Boodram was the P.I.R.O. Mr. Joseph made false allegations and based on an investigation carried out by the Personnel Committee against Mr. Alexander this Council made a clear decision with regards to Mr. Alexander. It was concluded that the Chief Executive officer carried out a flawed investigation and transferred Mr. Alexander without even interviewing him on allegations made against him.

The Council had asked that all those drivers be re-interviewed since he was of the view that people who served the Corporation over 25-30 years were not given the opportunity to have their children considered for employment. He stated that the policy for employment continues to change to accommodate corrupt practices by the PIRO Section.

Councillor Boodoosingh said that he moved a Motion with respect to naming of a street. Mr. Rambally sold property to Mr. Jinkoo with an existing road reserve and now Mr. Rambally was saying the road is his. Mr. Rambally has deep connections in the Corporation and now he has put up a street sign – "Rambally Avenue" and was in the process of building a gate blocking off Mr. Jinkoo who has been living in his land over 20 years. Mr. Rambally is an American citizen who came here and it seems that his law is above the Corporation.

The Municipal Corporation's Act is clear about Council's responsibilities, and Administration was told to act immediately with regards to the Motion for naming of the street according to the Act 21 of 1990 and open for other users to have access to their property.

Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh remarked that Administration continues to act in its own interest and not the people. There are instances where people's houses are broken down without approval of Council. He understood that the Building Inspector did not re-submit the plan to Town and Country Planning. The Council took a decision for the plans to be re-submitted to Town and Country Planning but the CEO instructed the Building Inspector not to re-submit the said plan. Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh asked that a copy be re-submitted to the Director of Surveys, Town and Country Planning along with the relevant Agencies. This is the first time in the history of the Penal/Debe Regional Corporation that the Director of Surveys has responded in two days time.

Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh also stated that he was looking at the Parliament Channel when the Chairman of Couva Tabaquite Talparo Regional Corporation indicated the Council has a responsibility and

must act on it. (3 ½) years have gone by and we continue to get no answers from Administration. He cannot get a report on dengue and rat infestation in the Palmiste area.

**Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh also made the following comments/requests:-**

- [i] Requested the backhoe for the Church of God Prophecy to clear Parking Lot.
- [ii] Requested the truck be sent to Pundit Ravi Bharati temple to remove old galvanize and other white waste.
- [iii] Requested estimate for the fencing of the Muslim cemetery in La Romaine.
- [iv] Requested a letter be sent to Ministry of Works with respect to road paving in Palmiste Electoral District. He received no funds last year nor this year and he took money under his recurrent allocation to pave Jewel Drive.
- [v] Requested one (1) tractor or grader for the Palmiste Park Management Committee to do some work in the Park. The Committee however will be accountable for the work being done with with the equipment.
- [vi] A meeting was held with the Palmiste Park Committee, T. & T.E.C. & Self Help Commission and certain commitments were made for lighting of the jogging track, the boulevard among others but nothing has been done to date.
- [vii] Dissatisfied with the response from the Water & Sewerage Authority with regards to the water situation in the region.
- [viii] Dissatisfied with the response of the Ministry of Works with regard to their response to requests made to them.
- [ix] Dissatisfied with the health section response to the dengue and rat infestation in Palmiste.
- [x] Dissatisfied with the inaction of Administration with regards to the removal of galvanize blocking a drain in Palmiste. The normal response is inaction and no one seemed to care about the safety of the traveling public.
- [xi] Dissatisfied with the Survey Section in dealing with the Hillpiece Pavilion. He had indicated that some Members of Council were not confident in the Survey Technician who he said was, was not supportive. They had asked for private surveying services.
- [xii] Disappointed that his fellow Councillors did not attend the (3) nights of prayers at Palmiste and thanked the President of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago for his attendance.
- [xiii] Thanked Mr. Jack Warner for his support and contribution towards Phagawa Celebrations in Palmiste.
- [xiv] Complimented Transport Foreman for his transformation of his section especially with work done with the new vehicles. He knows Mr. Alexander for (6) years.

497. **Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah made the undermentioned comments/requests:-**

- [i] Had to speak to the Work Supervisor I who told him to talk to the Road Officer about a diesel spill in a roadway. He did liaise with Mr. Zaffar Ali and got the job done.
- [ii] He spoke at the Physical Infrastructure Committee Meeting about electrification of the recreation ground in Golconda and the County Superintendent said he would look into the matter. When the County Superintendent went he looked at something else and advised the Council how much money to pay the contractor not where the boundary was.
- [iii] Minister Imbert was saying he never received any information from this Corporation but this was not the first time the Minister was caught lying.
- [iv] Also Road Improved Fund was removed from Local Government so how are we to get funds to pave roads.

498. **Councillor Willvan Ramlakhan made the following comments/requests:-**

- [i] Invited all again to the opening of the pavilion at Govindra Roopnarine Recreation Ground. Also requested the ground to be cut.
- [ii] The Sunrees Road Recreation Ground also needed to be cut and electricity supplied for its Easter Sunday Sports Day.
- [iii] Invited everyone to the Teemul Trace Annual Easter Sports and requested the presence of the Municipal Police.
- [iv] At the march for water he was amazed at the number of police officers present. However, he was glad the residents got water after the meeting with WASA.
- [v] He knows that the Transport Foreman is a very hard worker who goes beyond the call of duty and those false allegations made against him was very disheartening to Mr. Alexander. What was even more serious was that the allegations were forwarded to the police without proper investigations by Administration.
- [vi] Required the backhoe and truck to pick up debris at the Penal Presbyterian Church.

499. **Alderman Roland Hall made the following comments/requests:-**

- [i] Wondered why simple things take so much time to do example: The removal of galvanize blocking a drain. Also someone got their ankle broken while jogging along the track. “ Why” he asked can’t a letter be sent to the Management Committee of Palmiste Park telling them of the situation.

- [ii] Something needed to be done about illegal vending of fish and shrimp along the Palmiste Park leaving a stench behind.
- [iii] There is a dumping situation in Block 5. The place was cleared but the resident of #3 Sunridge took all his rubble and dumped it there. Ask the police to intervene.
- [iv] He has Repeatedly asked for the plans for the Tulsa Trace Picnic Site but had not received any to date and asked again if it could be furnished
- [v] On September 12, 2006 he distributed a document to Members of Council with respect to Youth Empowerment and was disappointed that not one Member of Council responded.

500. **Councillor Diptee Ramnath made the following comments/requests:-**

- [i] He recalled that there is a bridge program at Ministry's level which was utilized towards Teemul Trace bridge and Laltoo Trace bridge – and the Corporation should contact that unit for them to indicate their plans for bridges in Penal/Debe.
- [ii] Councillor Diptee remarked that all roads are the responsibility of Penal/Debe and there is no longer any agricultural access roadway. Caroni used to maintain the access roads but there is no Caroni and the Ministry must be made aware of these issues.
- [iii] With the recent showers some places had flooding and this is a clear indication that we are not prepared for the rainy season. The Minister of Local Government and the Ministry of Works needed to be made aware to continue excavation works of the water courses.

501. **Councillor Roy Kissoon made the following comments/requests:-**

- [i] The Chaguanas Borough Corporation stopped an agency from damaging their roadway and this Corporation needed to follow the same pattern. The roadway in Jacksingh Street was damaged so badly that the dust has turned into mud and school children had to pass through this.
- [ii] A company named Operational Support was doing work in La Romaine and their weep holes was throwing water into people premises.
- [iii] Required the grader to spread (100) loads of earthfill in the recreation ground in La Romaine.
- [iv] Still awaiting meeting with Estate Management and Business Development Company Ltd (EMBDC) regarding the Lagoon Cemetery and other issues.
- [v] He had never seen so much red tape to get the Self Help Water Project in Hermitage Village, started.
- [vi] The dumping of garbage in the Ring Road was getting worse.

502. **Councillor Premchand Sookoo made the following comments/requests:-**

- [i] Wondered whether Penal/Debe was treated with contempt by the Government. A newspaper front page headline saying no water for (1) day in Port-of-Spain. However, in Penal/Debe people was suffering for months for water and nobody cares.
- [ii] There is a correspondence from Caroni stating that all roads, traces, and recreation grounds were transferred to Penal/Debe and a designated liaison officer was appointed. However that person had never met with the Corporation.
- [iii] The Minister of Works was saying in the newspaper that Penal/Debe never submitted documents for Cuchawan Trace landslip. However, all document were sent to the Minister of Local Government who did not communicate with the Minister of Works.
- [iv] The Prime Minister went to Barrackpore fooling the resident by saying he could not believe their suffering when only recently the people blocked the roadway and hundreds of police army personnel flocked to the place and beat and arrested people.
- [v] The records will show that under the United National Congress [U.N.C.] Government many things were built in Penal/Debe such as Debe High School, NAMDEVCO, Debe Police Post, Post Office, Library among others. But under the P.N.M. Government only one bridge [in Suchit Trace} was built at the cost of \$10M.

503. **CHAIRMAN CLOSING REMARKS:**

The Chairman thanked the Members of Council for continuing to serve their electoral district given the challenges. All agencies have been written to but they are not responding. Therefore we should take the example of Chaguanas Borough Corporation and use our authority.

There being no further business the Chairman thanked all for attendance and terminated the meeting at 12:05 p.m.

367. Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh announced that the Pandavas would be hosting a three nights Vishnu Puran Desh Yagna at Palmiste National Park from 01 – 03 March, 2007 followed by Pagwa celebrations. The President of the Republic would be the guest speaker on the first night and other distinguished leaders along with the public are also invited.

He stressed that the stage forms should be transported to the site and the health gang be assigned to clean up on Monday after.

368. Councillor Premchand Sookoo announced that Park Avenue was not receiving truck borne water although it is in the schedule, and other areas include Transfer Village, Dignity, high points in Congo Village, Ramai Trace, Lalbeharry Trace, Mahadeo Trace, Ragbir Trace, Boodoo Trace, Laltoo Trace and several other roads and traces that continue to suffer for a lack of water. He also announced that over the last 2 – 3 weeks, 15- 20 trucks were transporting earthfill via Lalbeharry Trace into Ramai Trace and Ragbir Trace.

Councillor Willvan Ramlakhan enquired about the status of truck borne water.

The Public Health Inspector III informed that Truck Borne Water commenced on Thursday 15, February 2007, however only seven trucks reported for work on that day. Eventually twenty (20) trucks took up the awards and he was able to get two (2) additional working days in order to satisfy all the areas. Only on Monday 26 February 2007 all areas could be serviced.

Councillor Premchand Sookoo stated that up to the Sunday, Park Avenue and Congo Village were not receiving truck borne water and Ramdhanie Trace received twice. The truck for Area 39 was giving water outside the area and residents from everywhere kept calling him for water. He said if there is any shortfall to please have it corrected because everyone deserved a water supply.

Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh commented that he received phone calls that checkers were not allowed to sign the register at the hydrant. Since there was no policy regarding signing of register all Checkers who reported for work should be paid.

The Public Health Inspector remarked that all the Checkers were paid and subsequently the fortnightly list of workers would be done from the PIRO Section.

Alderman Dr. Allen Sammy reminded Members that Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah, as Chairman of Public Health Committee and Councillor Premchand Sookoo, as Vice Chairman have the authority to visit the hydrant at all times.

**OTHER PUBLIC BUSINESS: -**

415. **Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah made the undermentioned comments/requests: -**

[i] Before 2002 the former Alderman Patricia Grant, brought up the issue and, since then, the Building Inspector, County Superintendent and Survey Technician served Notices to Mr. Valmiki of Mendoza Drive to remove a fence he constructed in the roadway but nothing was done since then. He asked if the Corporation was waiting for someone to be injured before something gets done. People were continually calling him about the abusive treatment meted out to them by Mr. Valmiki.

[ii] Six weeks ago as Chairman of Public Health, he requested a meeting with the Public Health Inspector but this had not happened yet. Also as Chairman of Public Health, he felt the Public Health Inspector did not give him the respect, for instance he wasn't even informed about the commencement of truck borne water commencement nor rat baiting.

- [iii] His bills were not paid because the Chief Executive Officer told Council that he was cutting grass and heard a public announcement about a political meeting held by Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah. However the Chief Executive Officer gave a cheque to a contractor before completion of the work and he said the contractor required the cheque because his family was going abroad. Only when he was questioned about this then a letter was produced. The Chief Executive Officer went ahead and transferred the Transport Foreman based on allegations but nothing was done about the allegations on the Work Supervisor. He said all these are double standards.

Alderman Dr. Allen Sammy again reminded everyone that Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah is Chairman of Public Health Committee and if he requested a meeting with the PHI, then it must be entertained. Administration to arrange a meeting with Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah and the Public Health Inspector within seven (7) days. Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah to indicate an agenda inclusive of "other business." He said the same policy should be adopted for Chairman of all Committees. The Chairman also stated that he indicated to the Chief Executive Officer that Councillor Sonnylal B. Manwah felt he was being bypassed in the conduct of his business.

416. **Councillor Willvan Ramlakhan made the undermentioned comments/requests: -**

- [i] Thanked the Ministry of Works for a good job in cleaning the drains along Clarke Road.
- [ii] Thanked those who were responsible for repairing the landslip in Clarke Road.
- [iii] He had to speak on the radio about the water problems faced by the residents. He requested another meeting with WASA - (Wayne Joseph) as early as possible or else the residents may have to take protest action against WASA.
- [iv] A drain was being constructed in Dookie Street and the materials were dropped dangerously on the roadway. Without any caution signs serious accidents could occur.
- [v] Complaints from outside the Councillors' district were referred to them and some guidance regarding the boundaries should be given to the complaints personnel.
- [vi] The Transport Foreman was transferred from his post because of allegations. However many other complaints came about other workers but not one was investigated. Mr. Alexander is one of the most approachable and co-operative workers and he was targeted because of allegations made against him. Not even the County Superintendent nor the Inspector of Police were aware of the matter, leading one to assume that there is some sort of sabotage. He hoped what happened to the Officer can be reversed.

417. **Councillor Roy Kissoon made the undermentioned comments/requests: -**

- [i] An IRIAD job in Woodland was completed but the materials remained stored on the people's premises.

- [ii] The outfall drains leading into the Caroni lands needed to be cleared.
- [iii] Trinity Asphalt Pavers continued to destroy the roadway along with resident's premises, leaving the area in a very deplorable condition. He wanted some photos taken out of the place.
- [iv] Reminded everyone that he would need the backhoe and backfill for the Self Help water project at Hermitage.
- [v] API had promised to restore the roadway from the Ring Road to La Fortune on completion of their project of running lines, but this has not yet been done.

418. **Councillor Premnath Boodoosingh made the undermentioned comments/requests: -**

- [i] Congratulated Councillor Diptee Ramnath on his marriage.
- [ii] This Administration building was deemed unsafe by the OSHA Committee, however, for the length of time recommendations were made to move out, it seemed that Administration was not putting things in place as swiftly as needed.
- [iii] He never complained about the Transport Foreman, Mr. Alexander but about the lack of resources in the section. One casual employee was trying to destroy the entire organization. Everyone except Mr. Alexander was interviewed but only Mr. Alexander was transferred without any investigations and this put the Council in a position where it is open for lawsuit. He strongly felt it was a case of victimization.
- [iv] At the last statutory meeting he commented on a serious situation in Palmiste Boulevard but nothing was done and no reason given. The Act 21/1990 is very clear about blockage of roadway.
- [v] A pharmacy located at Palmiste junction was installing signs throughout Palmiste advertising its business. This practice has to be stopped immediately because residents were complaining.
- [vi] He also spoke about rat infestation in Palmiste area but got no response to date.
- [vii] Since the inception of Council the issue of stray dog was brought up but nothing was done to date.
- [viii] The Minister needed to be aware that he indicated that the Palmiste sewer system would be fixed. In the meantime the residents and school children of the Cedar Grove Primary School continue to live under those hazardous conditions.
- [ix] The Minister should also be reminded of his promise for the Barrackpore market when he said to submit a proposal and he would release funds.
- [x] A meeting was held with the Palmiste Park Committee, T.& T.E.C. & Self Help Commission and certain commitments were made such as lights in the jogging track and the Boulevard, lights to Pinard Court, Hillpiece Recreation Ground and others, however nothing has been done to date.

- [xi] Request one tractor to grade the roadway from the jogging track to clear vegetation that is posing a security threat. He was told that the jogging track would be extended.
- [xii] Wished Councillor Rampersad Hardial speedy recovery and requested a card be sent.

19. **Councillor Diptee Ramnath made the undermentioned comments/requests: -**

- [i] Extended speedy recovery to Councillor Rampersad Hardial.
- [ii] Requested one trip of water to #1 Goodman Trace and water to Quarry Road, Morne Diablo.
- [iii] Requested transport to Port of Spain for a visit to the Minister of Local Government.
- [iv] While they were told that everything was working well with truck borne water distribution, some traces such as Jagroop Trace were still not receiving water.
- [v] Mendoza Drive needed to have a turning point.

20. **Councillor Carl Dabideen made the undermentioned comments/requests: -**

Sometime last year he moved a motion of 'no confidence' in the Chief Executive Officer, but he was adding to that the incompetence and inability of the Chief Executive Officer to deal with matters. All things were put in place for the implementation of a dog catching unit but, like others, any item that impacts on the life of the burgesses was handled foolishly by the Chief Executive Officer.

Recent acting arrangements in the Health section was working very well, but the Chief Executive Officer transferred people from the position they deserve to be in leaving them demotivated. Again the Chief Executive Officer was showing his incompetence and inability to administer.

There are so many references in terms of non delivery of services by administration and that was the reason why he always says he gets more done out of Committee stage because the Chief Executive Officer, who knows what has to be done, tries to stifle and frustrate Council. All works that were done in his electoral district was put in the Programme of Works and approved at meetings.

He reinforced the point that he has no confidence in the Chief Executive Officer who is deliberately trying to make the Council look bad, as clearly evidenced by the handling of the Transport Foreman issue.

21. **Councillor Premchand Sookoo made the undermentioned comments/requests: -**

- [i] Many of the truck borne water contractors who were delinquent last year were again given contracts this year. He asked why was Cuchawan Trace receiving water from a truck assigned to Bunsee Trace.

- [ii] Estimates kept coming for Council's approval but no place of shelter were provided for the workers at the water hydrant nor were any toilet facilities provided. At least a park disposal unit should be provided.
- [iii] The gang structure needed to be revisited in order to avoid duplication.

22. **CHAIRMAN'S CLOSING REMARKS**

The Chairman reminded all about the prayer session at Palmiste, which would be followed by Phagwa celebrations at various venues around the country.

There being no further business the Chairman thanked all for attendance and terminated the meeting at 12:10 p.m.
